

Remember to report Controlled Drugs Incidents to your CDAO



If you experience an issue/concern relating to the prescribing, dispensing, storage or administration of controlled drugs—**REPORT THESE INCIDENTS TO YOUR CDAO**. Examples of incidents may include:

- Dispensing errors
- Prescription / prescriber errors
- Wrong dosage prescribed
- Medication label error
- Concerns about misappropriation of CDs by a health care professional / member of the public
- · Record keeping errors or omissions
- Theft or significant spillages of CDs
- Fraudulent attempts to obtain CDs
- CD storage issues
- Incorrect formulation
- Stock balance discrepancies
- · Controlled drug administered incorrectly



You will be asked to provide details of the incident and actions taken, such as:

- What immediate action was taken?
- Was the patient contacted?
- Were there any adverse effects to the patient, what action was taken if so?
- Was the prescriber informed?
- Who has been informed/notified of the incident?
- What measures have been put in place to prevent recurrence of this incident?
- What have you learned from the incident?
- Have you shared learning with your team?
