PQS: Antibiotic review data published

The NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) has published a spreadsheet showing which community pharmacy contractors have submitted data for their antibiotic review as part of the Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS) 2022/23. Details here.

PQS: Declaration window now open

The declaration window for the Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS) 2022/23 is now open. Community pharmacy contractors can make a claim for a PQS payment up until 11.59pm on Friday 3rd March 2023 through the Manage Your Service (MYS) portal. Details here.

Valproate audit reminder

PSNC has issued a reminder about the mandatory national audit on valproate. The last day on which pharmacy contractors can start the audit is Saturday 18th February. NHSBSA has published an initial set of data about submissions so far and they will publish further updates over the next few weeks. Find out more here.

SSPs: Penicillin V

Due to continuing supply issues, the eight Serious Shortage Protocols (SSPs) currently in effect for Penicillin V products (SSPs 040-047) which are due to end on 31 January are being extended. The end date for these SSPs will now be 28 February 2023. In addition, SSPs 043-047 have been amended to remove the options of azithromycin and clarithromycin.

One Off Prescriptions & Nominations (Coventry & Warwickshire)

There have been instances of patients having to use more than one pharmacy over recent weeks with some supply chain issues or temporary closures etc. The GP practices don't need to change the regular nomination to allow different pharmacies to dispense – some do set up a one-off nomination through EMIS. When you dispense for a non-regular patient under these circumstances you must not change their permanent nomination unless it is at the express request of the patient and their decision should not impact on the supply against the presenting adhoc script.
