#### New learning outcomes

- Enhanced clinical capabilities.
- Independent Prescribing (IP) at point of registration

### Quality management of training sites in England delegated to NHSE- recruited through WTE becoming the Statutory Education Body (SEB) for pharmacy in summer 2024

All trainee pharmacists **ORIEL** from 2025/26. No approval of sited by NHSE or GPhC outside of this process

Harmonisation of funding across all sites and sectors £26,500 per trainee in 2025/26

# For 2025/26 trainees, placements must be added to Oriel in January-March 2024

This will be the **only** process for pharmacist trainee recruitment

Employers confirm the trainee will have access to

- Designated Supervisor (DS)
- Prescribing Learning Setting
- Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP)

All training sites must use the Assessment Strategy and e-portfolio (awaiting procurement) and engage with the NHSE-WTE Quality Framework - this will include activities relating to prescribing

### Multi-sector rotational training will be mandatory from 2026/27

In 2025/26 identify on Oriel whether multi-sector rotation is included

#### Recognised sectors are:

- mental health trusts
- Community Pharmacy
- •General Practice (and Health and Justice)

One lead employer is required (host)

•NHS Managed Sector – including acute trusts and |Multi-sector rotation = a 13-week or 26-week rotation into another sector of practice

- All training sites must be located within a "reasonable" geographic distance from the base site.
- Information about travel arrangements for rotations should be provided, such as availability (or lack) of transport links including public transport.
- •It cannot be a requirement that a trainee has a car.
